WEDNESDAY 12 JUNE 2019

#### *COACH TRIP TO BRUISYARD HALL AND STOWMARKET, SUFFOLK*

Prior to visiting Bruisyard Hall, there will be a lunch stop at Stowmarket, where there are many places to have a good lunch. Stowmarket Church contains the burial vault of the Tyrrell family of Gipping, with monuments dated from 1449 to the 18<sup>th</sup> Century. The site of the Tyrrell chapel is still visible. This will be of interest to Ricardians because of the connection to James Tyrrell, one of the supposed murderers of the Princes in the Tower.

Bruisyard Hall is a fascinating house, given by Lionel, Duke of Clarence, the son of King Edward III, to a college of chantry priests in 1354. It was founded by Maud, Countess of Ulster, and once one of only four abbeys of the Poor Clares. The house has had an exciting and chequered history, but retains its idyllic historic setting within a 700-acre estate. Our guided tour will be given either by the owner, Robert Rouse, or by a member of the family. The house is being opened especially for us, so this is a great opportunity to see the interior of this hidden gem. Refreshments will be served after the tour and Jean understands that there will be cake!

Bayeux is a lovely town whose photogenic medieval centre has cobbled streets and half-timbered houses. Besides being home to the legendary Bayeux Tapestry, it also has many other attractions including the superb Museum of Art and History which is housed in an episcopal palace. Mont-Saint-Michel is one of Europe's most memorable sights. This thousand-year-old monument sits on its own island and is 80 metres above sea level. An amazing building both inside and out. The island is now accessible to people with reduced mobility. The free shuttle bus has disabled access and reserved seating, but there is a fantastic walkway for those who like a stroll. The views from the walkway are amazing. Jean has obtained a very good deal for full board at the 4 Star Novotel, Bayeux, which is situated on the outskirts of the town. It has an outdoor pool, a terrace and is set in a wooded park. The hotel comes recommended for its good food and clean rooms. It has good reviews online.

Price - £474.00 per person – this includes coach pick-ups, return Eurotunnel crossings, 3 nights bed and breakfast, all evening meals, all visits and entry fees.
